Please be advised that the entire greater Estate will have no water on Tuesday, 22 November 2022 from 08:30 to 17:00.

Residents are advised to plan their daily routines accordingly.

# STAY ALERT WHEN DRIVING

We need to be aware of the reality of the country we live in and the rise of crime even in our town and the environment around the Estate. We are fortunate to have the best Security Team and technology to keep our perimeter safe and protect us once we are inside the Estate.

We urge all residents to be alert when driving, especially at night. Please keep an eye out for any suspicious activity, and be vigilant. If drivers remain watchful, the chance is high that you will be able to spot someone following, stalking, or trying to push them off the road. Earlier this week, there was an incident involving a resident; thanks to his alertness, he could get away safely. Also, be mindful of the roadworks in the vicinity of the greater estate.

While our Security Team is always willing to assist residents, patrolling the R45 and R301 roads outside the Estate falls outside their scope of responsibility. The team will continue their regular patrols of Kliprug Manor Road and Jack Nicklaus Boulevard, where they lead into the greater estate. The Security Team maintains excellent working relationships with SAPS and other security companies in the area. The team always cooperates with SAPS once a case has been registered.

If a resident does not register a case with SAPS, they will have no record of it. Hotspots are identified by the location and number of cases registered in a particular area. SAPS uses statistics to determine the type of crime, the frequency and location. SAPS can only patrol and allocate resources if sufficient cases are registered. Please also remember that the Security Team can't open a case on behalf of any resident.

#### ALGAE BUILD UP IN THE LAKES

With the season's weather heating up fast, an algae bloom has been noticed in many of the Estate lakes.

These algae, one of the numerous Cladophora species that forms the floating mats that are so often complained about as being unsightly, grows because the nitrate and phosphate levels in the water are too high for the taller plants to absorb.

At this time of the year, the Estate's landscaping team is continually clearing the algae. However, as this is a time-consuming task, it is very difficult to keep up with the very fast regrowth.

The Estate is trying to reduce this occurrence by leaving the riparian zones of the lakes unmown, thereby creating a buffer zone of taller plants that will help absorb fertiliser run-off before it enters the water. Aquatic plants such as bulrush, water lilies and submerged watergrass, play important roles in absorbing dissolved nutrients that limit algae growth and contribute to the ecological balance of lakes.

As with any natural system, the ecology of a lake changes with the seasons. Managing a lake is a delicate balance between letting natural processes happen and keeping the lake clean and well-kept.



#### DOMESTIC RABBITS ON THE ESTATE

Recently, a number of residents spotted rabbits roaming around on the Estate.

Rabbits are unique pets with specific needs and habits. Rabbits like open areas where they can hop around, explore, and get their daily exercise.

While rabbits may be easy to love, they are not quite as easy to care for. Adopting any domestic pet is in fact a huge responsibility, especially in keeping them safe. Rabbit owners should ensure that their rabbits are always indoors, whether there is an outdoor area for them or not. Once rabbits are outside, they are at risk of being attacked and harmed by animals such as owls, dogs and snakes.

### MASTERING THE WEDGE GAME (30m - 100m from the pin)

Spending time at the short game facility at your golf club or driving range will most certainly be an advantage to your game and take a few extra shots off your scorecard during your round. Wedge play is actually very simple, if you think about it this way:

- It is not a shot that requires massive amounts of speed
- It's a skill that can easily be practised
- It gives variety to shot-making ability and the "feel" component of the game
- Because it is a smaller movement than the full swing it could serve as a foundation for technical flaw corrections with a better understanding of impact.

Please read below a few interesting points to take into consideration:

- SCORING COMPONENT (approximately 40% of your total score happens from 70m and in)
- UNDERSTANDING THE BOUNCE (specifically WET CONDITIONS AND ADDING LOFT).
   During winter, a higher bounce wedge with added loft is your friend. The rounded sole counts in your favour vs digging into muddy underfoot conditions with the lead edge of the club.
- CONTROLLING DISTANCE (LENGTH OF ARC, TEMPO OF SWING) In a nutshell we are
  looking for gradual acceleration through the shot-this will result in hitting the "middle window"
  from a trajectory point of view. <u>CLUB SELECTION</u>. Most players have at least 3 wedges in their
  bag. With varied lengths of backswings and follow-throughs. From here one can start building
  on a wedge chart and hitting your favoured numbers to order.
- Play around with WHAT WORKS BEST FOR YOU. A wider swing vs a narrower swing. Are
  you better when you pitch with a firmer wristed technique like Jason Day or let the levers go like
  Phil Mickelson.
- Capturing data-dial it in on the range. These are exciting times ahead at the Pearl Valley Golf Academy. Please come see us for our gap testing offering.

At the end of the day learn how to play "ugly golf" well and golf your golf ball! The scorecard and handicap are guaranteed to see improvement.


# **JUNIOR CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP 2022 RESULTS**
